

Cornus alba 'Bailhalo' - Ivory Halo Dogwood

Zone: 3-7

Height: 4'-6'

Width: 4'-6'

Exposure: Full sun, part shade
Form and Crown: Upright arching
Growth Rate: Rapid
Preferred Ph: Varied
Drought Tolerance: Good once established
Drainage: Good
Preferred Soil: Moist, well drained
Insect Pest: Few
Disease Problems: Canker

This shrub is very similar to *C. alba* 'Argentea-marginata', except that it is significantly smaller. It is also similar to *Cornus sericea/stolonifera*, but not so spreading. Flowers are not showy. It will make an excellent specimen if not pruned. If you want the reddest stems in winter, remove the older stems in late winter, or cut the plant back to the ground every 3 or 4 years.
