Pagoda Dogwood is a native of the Eastern United States. It is recognized by its flattened canopy and horizontal branching, creating a tiered effect. Abundant cymes of fragrant cream colored flowers appear in late spring. Later in the season dark blue fruit develop, which are a favorite of the birds. Fall color is striking display of deep red to orange. Pagoda dogwood grows well in full sun or shade, in moist, well drained soil. It is well suited for a number of uses, including under power lines. Pagoda Dogwood is grown from seed. We offer it in 2' and 3' multi-stem and tree form up to 1" caliper.
