

## Fraxinus americana 'Junginger'

## 'Autumn Purple' White Ash

Zone: 4-8

Height: 45'

Width: 35'

Crown: Oval, round with age

Growth Rate: Fast

Fall Color: not purple, what would you call it?

Soil: Very adaptable, prefers neutral pH

Seed: Seedless



Once the central leader of American Ash has been removed, it is nearly impossible to replace without a severe dogleg. So don't top this tree! As a young tree, Autumn Purple seems rather open, but the head will fill in by the time caliper reaches 2". Ash Aphid can be a problem, but not nearly as bad as Green Ash. Otherwise, this is an impressive tree. Autumn Purple seems to be somewhat of a misnomer. In Oregon the fall color is as you see it. Not purple so much as Crimson or Fire Brick, perhaps even a deep Pink. Not to worry. An Autumn Purple by any other name is still an Autumn Purple, and is still a stately tree.
