

## Tilia americana x euchlora

## 'Redmond' Linden

Zone: 4-8

Height: 40'-60'

Width: 30'

Crown: Pyramidal in youth, oval with age

Growth: Fast

Soil: Clay, loam, sand

pH: Acid or alkaline

Foliage: Up to 8" long

Flower: Yellow, fragrant

Trunk: Up to 6' at maturity

Branching: Strong



As with Tilia americana Sentry, Redmond is big in every category: size, leaf size, mature size, and fragrance. Big fragrance? You bet. Redmond requires full sun, and is adaptable to many soil and pH levels from acid to alkaline. It is very drought tolerant. Like American Sentry, it needs plenty of room to mature. Don't plant it too close to concrete or foundations. Introduced in Nebraska in 1942 and still popular with architects and landscapers, this tree has withstood the test of time.
