

Tilia cordata 'Corzam'

Corinthian® Linden

Zone: 3-8

Height: 45'

Width: 15'

Crown: Upright pyramidal
Growth: Medium
Soil: Clay, loam, sand, construction

Unlike the broadly oval species, *Tilia cordata* Corinthian® has a very uniform formal pyramidal shape. It's thick dark green heart shaped leaves turn golden yellow in fall. It's flowers in late June are very fragrant and attract bees. This tree has a tendency for a straight single leader. Branching from all around the circumference of young trees, unlike some of the other cultivars. They can be a little 'whoop de doo', so some pruning to select the main scaffold branches will need to be done. Aphids and Japanese Beetles can be a problem on all *T. cordatas*, but maybe, with the thicker leaf, this one will be more resistant. Corinthian® is a selection of Lake County Nursery.
