

## Viburnum lantana L. 'Mohican'

## 'Mohican' Viburnum

Zone: 3-8

Height: 6'

Width: 6'-8'

Crown: Rounded

Growth: Vigorous

Soil: Clay, loam, sand

pH: Acid, alkaline

Drainage: Well drained

Drought: Tolerant

Breakage: Resistant



Viburnum 'Mohican' is a selection of seed obtained from Poland, released in 1966. Its characteristics are: very dense growth habit, heavy dark green foliage, fruit that turns orange-red and remains effective as a display for a month or more, and is resistant to bacterial leaf spot. This plant is deciduous. Flowers are small, creamy white in cymes, and bloom in late April to early May. The flowers appear with the expanding young leaves. The fruit is a drupe which ripen to a bright orange-red in early July and stay so until they ripen to a black in a month or longer. The black fruit is very shiny and quite attractive. This is a plant for full sun, drier situations and loam or limestone soil with pH up to 7.
