Quercus alba is a native of eastern America, from the southern tip of Texas to the northern tip of Ontario; from west Nebraska to Cape Cod. It produces excellent hardwood lumber. This is a very large, slow growing tree. It needs a site with enough space to grow. Leaves are large, alternate, simple and lobed. Fall color is yellow to gold. Catkins are 2"-4" long and appear in spring. Acorns are large and useful to wild life.
